# SOCIAL SCIENCES AND HUMANITIES RESEARCH COUNCIL TIER 1 CANADA RESEARCH CHAIR POSITION (TIER 1 AND TIER 2)

The <u>Faculté des sciences sociales de l'Université Laval</u> (FSS) is launching a call for applications for Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) Canada Research Chair positions (Tier 1 and Tier 2).

The FSS, which has been actively involved in its community for more than 80 years, is training the next generation of change makers. Recognized worldwide as a reference in the area of innovation and social justice, it is contributing to the well-being of people, communities and the world. The FSS includes five Departments (anthropology, economics, industrial relations, political science and sociology) and two Schools (psychology, social work and criminology), with 170 faculty members and over 5,200 students. The FSS has teaching programs at three levels, including 16 master's and 9 doctoral programs. As regards research, since its foundation, the FSS has been promoting research and teaching projects that contribute to human and social development. It boasts 7 Canada Research Chairs, 13 Partnered Chairs, 2 Teaching Leadership Chairs, 14 research clusters and 5 scientific journals, making it a stimulating, dynamic and diverse research environment.

Committed to its milieu and community, Université Laval is a key partner of major players in Quebec City and contributes to Canadian innovations in development, research and knowledge transfer. By sharing knowledge, developing expertise and adopting a culture of diversity and inclusion, it is contributing to the growth of the community in a sustainable way. Université Laval has an international reputation, with more than 275 research centres, chairs, institutes and other clusters, including 82 Canada Research Chairs. #### Université Laval's commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion

In keeping with its recruitment policies, including the "Equal Employment Opportunity Program," Université Laval is committed to promoting excellence in research and research training and guaranteeing equal opportunity for all qualified candidates. Université Laval upholds the principle that excellence and equity go hand in hand. candidate profiles until its representation targets are met, in accordance with the requirements of the CRC Program.

#### Profile sought

The <u>Canada Research Chair (CRC) program</u> aims to attract and retain in Canada accomplished and promising researchers from across the globe.

The <u>Tier 1</u> Chairs, so-called "Seniors", are intended for outstanding researchers recognized by their peers as likely to become leaders in their field. These chairs, which are seven years in duration and renewable once, are valued at \$200,000 per year and help finance the salary of the holder.

Candidates for a Tier 1 Chair must be proposing an original and innovative research program of the highest quality and possess abilities in teaching and supervising graduate students.

The <u>Tier 2</u> Chairs, so-called "Juniors", are intended for outstanding researchers recognized by their peers as likely to become leaders in their field. These chairs, which are five years in duration and renewable once, are valued at \$100,000 per year and help finance the salary of the holder. A research allocation of \$20,000 per year accompanies the Tier 2 chairs during the first five years of the mandate. This allocation is to be used for the direct costs of research. In addition, applicants must have been active researchers in their fields for <u>less than ten</u> years at the time of their application.

Candidates for a Tier 2 Chair must have the status of Assistant Professor or Associate Professor or be qualified for a position at that level.

### Career interruption and personal circumstances

In keeping with the values of diversity and equity, Université Laval acknowledges that career interruption and personal circumstances (e.g. maternity or parental leave, leave for prolonged illness, clinical training or family care) as well as a disability may have an effect on productivity and contributions in research. Applicants are invited to explain, as appropriate, these effects so that they are taken into account in the assessment of their applications.

#### Accomodation

In addition, accommodation can be offered to people with disabilities according to their needs in this competition, in strict confidentiality. # Description of the position

The Canada Research Chair status will allow the holder to devote more time to research activities as part of his/her professorial duties. Duties include research, publication and outreach activities, teaching at the three levels, supervising master's and Ph.D. students, and any other activity provided for in the professors' collective agreement.

Applicants must have a Ph.D. in a discipline taught or related to those taught at the FSS and must provide evidence of excellence in teaching and research.

In this call for applications, the FSS welcomes applicants working in the following research fields:

- anthropology,
- economics,
- psychology,
- industrial relations,
- political science,
- sociology
- social work and criminology: theme of economic crime.

#### Requirements

The Canada Research Chair Program is based on an unwavering commitment to excellence in research and training. Applicants must demonstrate a significantly greater contribution compared to other researchers working in the same field in Canada (Tier 2) or internationally (Tier 1). This contribution is defined by a global assessment of the applicants' achievements, in particular in teaching, research, student supervision, publication, knowledge transfer and leadership. The individual selected by the FSS will have to successfully undergo an internal selection process at Université Laval as part of the CRC selection competitions (link to French document here) and an assessment by the Canada Research Chair program.

Le Programme des Chaires de recherche du Canada est fondé sur un engagement indéfectible à l'égard de l'excellence en recherche et en formation. Les candidates et candidats doivent démontrer un apport différentiel important comparativement à des chercheuses ou



chercheurs œuvrant dans le même domaine au Canada (niveau 2) ou à l'international (niveau 1).

The application package must include:

- A CV in pdf format. It should be the CRC CV.
- A description of the proposed research program (maximum 4 pages). It should be in pdf format.

- The Self-Identification Form (link to French document here)
- A short cover letter specifying the tier of the Chair for which you are applying and the desired Department or School of affiliation (anthropology, economics, psychology, industrial relations, political science, sociology, social work and criminology).

The entire application file should be submitted in a single email to <a href="research@fss.ulaval.ca">research@fss.ulaval.ca</a> no later than October 1, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. (Quebec time).

## Receipt of applications

Calendar for the submission of applications:

- October 1, 2021, 4:00 p.m.: End of the application period for the FSS competition.
- Evaluation of applications by Departments and Schools. Announcement of results to participants by November 8. Successful candidates will be able to improve their application to be submitted to the Université Laval competition.
- December 1, 2021: Submission of applications to the Vice Rector of Research, Creation and Innovation (VRRCI), for the Université Laval competition.
- Mid-February: Announcement of the results of the evaluation by the VRRCI.
- April 25, 2022: Due date for the letters of support from the Faculty to be submitted to the VRRCI.
- June 2022: Announcement of final results of the Université Laval competition
- As soon as possible, no later than December 15, 2022: Submission of applications to the Tri-agency Institutional Programs Secretariat.

Each Department and School of the Faculty of Social Sciences will determine the dates for meeting the candidates; a meeting is likely to happen in October 2021 if the Department or School selects your application following the reception of the files.
